Marcia Ault, 79, of Alliance and a former longtime Ogallala resident, died Wednesday, August 22, 2012 in Highland Park Care Center in Alliance.

Marcia Margaretha (Scharrel) Ault was born June 10, 1933 in Lodgepole. She was raised in Lodgepole and graduated from Lodgepole High School. She attended Midland Lutheran College in Fremont. Marcia was employed at Brandeis Department Store in Omaha.

She later returned to the Ogallala area to assist in family cares and this is when she met Roderick Ault. On April 30, 1955 the couple was married. Marcia worked many years as a nurse for Dr. Drost in Ogallala. In 1980 Marcia received training in Denver to become a Certified Kidney Dialysis Technician. She also did private care and provided in home kidney dialysis before dialysis units existed. She was also employed at the Ogallala Community Hospital and Indian Hills Manor.



Marcia moved to Alliance in 2011.

Marcia was a member of St. Lukes Catholic Church, served on the Altar Society, was a Eucharistic Minister, and taught Catechism classes. She was active with the ESU and the PAKS residences. Other memberships included American Association of Retarded Citizens and the Kidney Dialysis Foundation. Marcia especially enjoyed calling on shut-ins and playing Pinochle with friends. Her hobbies included sewing, arts, crosswords, word games, cooking, baking, and reading. Marcia loved music and played the piano by ear.

Preceding her in death were her parents, her husband Rod in 1997, and five sisters: Betty Lehn, Estaline Bayley, Viola Nordberg, June Scharrel, and Phyllis Heath.
