



Gene Spear September 4, 1932 – February 14, 2013

Gene Spear, 80, longtime Ogallala resident, died Thursday, February 14, 2013, in the Ogallala Community Hospital.

Eugene Edwin "Gene" Spear was born September 4, 1932 in Ogallala, the son of Edwin and Clementine (Szydzik) Spear. Shortly after his birth, his parents moved to a ranch near Keystone, Nebraska. In 1948 the family moved to Ogallala.

After graduating from Ogallala High School in 1950 Gene joined the United States Navy. After a year in the Aleutian Islands he was assigned to the Naval Air Stations in Jacksonville, Fla. and

Preceding him in death were his parents and an infant son Steven Mark Spear. Survivors include his wife Jan Spear of Ogallala; Three daughters: Mary (Kevin) Kuxhausen of Mitchell; Christine Meyer of Paxton; and Diane (Brandon) Stevenson of Lincoln.
